Description: This is a four-day school that provides detailed instruction and considerable range firing to both beginner and advanced prone competitors. The emphasis is on wind/mirage reading, with a thorough review of prone shooting fundamentals. At the conclusion of the school, a two-day Prone Registered Match is held at the hosting range. This is a good opportunity for prone school students to test their newly acquired knowledge in a match setting.

Participants: In past years, very experienced prone competitors have attended the school alongside beginner level competitors. This broad range of experience translates to a considerable exchange of knowledge and assistance in becoming better competition shooters.

Instructor: George Harris, veteran smallbore rifle competitor and recently retired from the NRA, as the chief instructor.

Cost: Cost of the school is \$300. Students are responsible for their own transportation, housing, and meals during the school. Some meals ARE provided. See daily schedule for details. Included in the \$300 fee is entry fee for the registered match on Saturday June 22nd and Sunday June 23rd.
